

# Tucson H.O.G. Group Riding Procedure: Changing Lanes

One of the most important skills in group riding is making smooth, safe lane changes. Tucson H.O.G. follows a consistent procedure so every rider knows what to expect and the group can move as one.

# 1. The Road Captain initiates the move.

The Road Captain (RC) riding at the front of the group will decide when a lane change is necessary. The RC signals first, giving enough time for the group to prepare, but no one should change lanes until the lead RC does so.

# 2. The Sweep Rider secures the lane.

The Sweep (rider at the back) moves into the new lane as soon as it is safe, creating a block that prevents other vehicles from cutting into the group.

# 3. The group follows in order.

Once the lane is secured, riders change lanes from the front to the rear (follow the leader and the bike in front of you NOT behind you). This prevents riders from cutting across traffic unpredictably.

### 4. Maintain formation.

Each rider moves into their proper staggered position in the new

lane, keeping safe spacing and formation discipline.

# **Key Reminders:**

- Always check your mirrors and blind spots before moving.
- Signal clearly and cancel your signal after the lane change.
- Never rush. If traffic breaks the group during the maneuver, the RC will adjust the ride until everyone is safely back together.

By following this procedure, Tucson H.O.G. ensures smoother, safer rides and keeps the group moving as one team on the road.




